

This visit will demonstrate the latest activity by Bennamann to capture methane emissions from dairy slurry and use them on farms to replace fossil fuels in tractors and trucks and to generate renewable electricity.

Biomethane can reduce the carbon footprint of farm and industrial operations by providing green fuel for vehicles, machinery operations or on-site electricity generation.

Participants will visit Bennamann's Headquarters at Chynoweth Farm where the team will share information about their methane capture technology, and then visit a nearby dairy farm where a system is installed to hear about its operation first-hand from the farmer.

Who should attend?

Anyone interested in the prevention of global warming should attend. We welcome Farmers, Businesses, organisations, and members of the public who would like to see an example of fugitive methane being captured and utilised.

Why should they attend?

Find out about the opportunity to decarbonize a large part of Cornwall's carbon footprint. In doing so, participants will be able to see the technology and operations first hand and gain an understanding of the realistic financial benefits and carbon footprint benefits.
