News and Queries

The annual **European Biosolids and Organic Resources' conference** is due to take place in Manchester on 19/20th November. The conference covers a broad range of topics of relevance to the water and waste industries - including anaerobic digestion, process optimisation, dewatering and land bank availability. Aqua Enviro's water industry contacts are very keen to learn more about the potential for optimising the biology within their AD systems - and particularly, how to base their approaches on an understanding at the genetic level (turning the emerging science into usable tools). The conference organisers would therefore like to host an interactive academic/industry session on this theme, to run in parallel with the main conference. There will also be opportunities for ECR poster presentations - both on this specific theme, and on more general biowaste / bioresource processing topics.

One of our members has asked if anyone in the membership can help with the following query:

"How do we quantify the microbial numbers present in the inoculum before the start of a BMP test and during a BMP test, other than quantifying the volatile solids content basing it on this?

One of our objectives is to determine how much microbial biomass yield is achieved from the substrate that we use. We are also trying to build a continuous model for AD and for this we can keep the cells in the digester constant by maintaining the flowrates, but would need the numbers for a typical system based our batch BMP. So if we can quantify the microbial biomass at different stages, then it would help us build a better model to predict our systems."
