UKRI Interdisciplinary Circular Economy Coordinator

Webinar dates: 17th and 22nd October
Deadline for "Intent to Submit": 31st October
Deadline for "Proposal": 19th November 2019

Up to £150k (at 80% FEC) is available for this initial grant to engage with the full spectrum of interdisciplinary research and stakeholder communities and design a proposal for an Interdisciplinary Circular Economy Hub, with up to £3.3m available at the second stage for the Coordinator to lead the integration Hub -transitioning to a more circular economy, where resources are processed with sustainability, waste minimisation and efficiency in mind, and where product lifecycles are optimised to generate more economic and social value before recycling and/or reuse.
